

We will start off our year with a novel study on the book *Number the Stars*. We will also be learning a little more about the different genres of poetry. Students will also be introduced to our spelling and grammar and typing programs this year and will receive their first spelling list next Monday. Our first spelling quiz will be on Friday, September 13th.

Music: We will start working with our recorders this month, so if you could, please have your child bring their recorders to school. If you do not have a recorder, order forms will be sent out this week.

Science: We will be working through a unit on Biodiversity this month.

Social Studies: We will be working through a mini unit on culture and worldview this month.

Art: We are starting off the year strong with some well-loved graffiti name art that the senior classes got to do last year. Hopefully it will all but done and hung up for you to see by the open house/BBQ on Friday!

Science Fair: We are starting the year off with a bang! Right away, we will be looking at what a science fair is, how to choose a topic and coming up with a game plan. The science fair takes place in mid-November so we are asking the students to come up with a topic by Wednesday, September 11th.

Grade 7

Mr. Teeuwen

Hello, and welcome back to the beginning of a new school year! I am very excited to be called to be teaching this group of grade 7 students and looking forward to having a wonderful year with them. Please keep us in your prayers as I will be keeping the students, parents, and staff in my prayers as well.

This week we will be settling into routines, learning expectations of Christ-like behaviour rooted in the Bible and our faith. The students will be introduced to our first units throughout the week as well and we'll begin using our planners to begin some solid organizational skills.

In Bible, our first unit is Themes of the Old Testament where we will explore God's story as laid out beginning in the book of Genesis in the Old Testament. We will be learning about God's promises to redeem his people from the Fall brought on by sin, and his plan of redemption.

In Math, we begin looking at Numbers and Numeration and specifically looking at representing and comparing whole numbers up to and including one billion, as well as powers of ten. We will then move towards looking at perfect squares and how to determine square roots.

In Language Arts we will begin in Reading Comprehension with a short stories unit titled *Choices and Decision*' and by looking at what is a short story, examining examples in the parables and then moving towards looking at the short stories in our *Choices and Decisions* book. The themes of these stories are rooted in Christ-like behaviour, and we will examine how the characters navigate these decisions. We will also be looking at nouns in grammar, and begin penmanship and typing practice as well this week.

In Health we will be examining mental health, mental illness and connecting that with how God is the great physician, how Jesus cured every manner of illness and how part of our strategy in maintaining a healthy mental health is being well-rooted in Christ, and in prayer.

For Physical Education we will be working on co-operative games, and moving towards soccer and cross country as well.

In Geography, we will be starting our unit titled 'My Father's World' and first looking at what makes us tick, why we choose what we choose, and how we are God's crowning glory in creation.

We will also be starting our Science Fair looking at topics and examining the outline and expectations for what makes a good science fair project. The Science fair will be held in early November so we will be launching that now to give the students plenty of time to choose a topic and research on it. The students will receive an outline with due dates for that which will be put in their agendas (red folders).

Finally, in Art, we will be working on a self-portrait that will be combined with a six word memoir to describe each student.

Welcome to a new school year at John Knox Christian School! Our Grade Eights are on the brink of significant change and new experiences. Today is their last first day of middle school! What an incredible milestone! Therefore, this year will be about academics, nurturing our faith, and building character. Our theme for this year is "The Fruits of the Spirit." The Apostle Paul describes these fruits in Galatians 5:22-23, where he writes: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things, there is no law." We will cultivate and tend to our connection with God, even more, this year and inevitably express these fruits in our daily lives!

During the first week of school, we will get to know each other and establish routines and expectations. Each student will also receive a W.O.W. binder (Wonderfully Organized Work) that contains each day's homework and essential forms that go home daily. A guide for the upcoming Science Fair can also be found there.

Here is a quick summary of some of the units we are beginning:

Math: A unit on Number Sense.
